

# **Jew Plum / June Plum**

# **Care Tips**

### Water (Frequency):

Water seedlings once per day. When plant is more mature, water as needed. It is recommended that watering is done in the early mornings or late evening.

### Pruning (Frequency):

Prune to keep at desirable shape and size.

#### Common Pests and Treatments:

In case of an attack by caterpillars or fungus, your plant may be treated with the following:

- Actara or Caprid (insecticides)
- Sulcox or Rudomil or Champion (insecticides)

Be guided by manufacters' directions for use of insecticides and fungicides.

DIY: \*In 5 litres of water, cut 5 cups neem leaves or 7 bulbs onion or garlic into small pieces. Leave covered for 3 days or boil for 20 minutes. Dilute each cup of pesticide with 1 cup soapy water (gentle liquid soap is recommended). Spray mixture onto affecetd areas of plant in the early morning or late evening to prevent burning. Rinse plant after a few hours to remove residue. Reapply mixture if the pests remain or return after treatment.

Potted Plant: The dwarf variety can be grown in a pot or outdoors. It bears smaller fruits in a much shorter time.



 Agroforestry: Planted among other crops for crop diversification.

Native Range Melanesia, Polynesia

Height at Maturity 10-15m

Time to Maturity 4-5 years

Fruiting Period September to January

Light Preference Full sun

Soil Preference Adaptable to most soil types but prefers well-drained soil

Location Preference Adaptable to most areas
