Topic: Forests and the Environment

Instructions: Match the descriptions (left) with the corresponding forest classification by placing the number on the line.

- Forest that shows human disturbance and has broadleaf trees; an example is the Bull Head Forest Reserve.
- 2. Grows in salty water; trees roots grow above the ground
- 3. Forest which grows up to 30m in height with trees that have stilt roots
- 4. Primary forest with closed canopy and minimal human disturbance.
- 5. Shows significant human disturbance; referred to as regen forest.
- Forest with trees crowns that are not interlocked; trees can grow up to 15m
- 7. Forest with shrubs and brush taht grow between 1-5m; Lovers' Leap Forest Reserve in St. Elizabeth is an example.
