Tree Planting – Debunking the Myth

Abstract: The presentation will give a qualitative description of the experiences of a private Agro-Forester. It will outline the benefits being enjoyed and pursued as well as the challenges and downsides of this tree-planting enterprise.

Key inputs, resources, difficulties, and setbacks will be discussed alongside the benefits that have been realised in the past and are expected in the future.

The multi-potential enterprise of tree planting will be demonstrated to be a versatile vehicle which can reach points of spiritual, physical, and financial wellbeing for the individuals, organisations and communities which participate.
